COURSE OVERVIEW AND BENEFITS

The Administration of Anti-Cancer Drug Therapies double module offers the opportunity for qualified practitioners involved in the administration and care of patients receiving anti-cancer drug therapies, to enhance their knowledge, skills and expertise.

The double module content looks at all aspects of the knowledge and theory surrounding the administration of anti-cancer drug therapies, such as physiology, pharmacology, health and safety issues, assessing and managing side effects and the policies effecting anti-cancer drug administration. This is a double module.
