## FAQs for MSc International Project Management and MSc International Logistics & Supply Chain Management



1. What is the exact course fee for those starting in January and September 2013?

The course fee is £6950 GBP irrespective of the start date.

- Is this above fee for the entire 24 month period?
   Yes the course fee covers all distance learning modules and the final dissertation.
- 3. Does the fee cover all study materials and examination fee?
  Yes
- 4. What is the bursary available for students participating in either of these postgraduate courses, and how much bursary will be available for each student?

Exceptional students may receive a bursary ranging from £500 - £1500 (subject to application).

- 5. Aside the fee will there be other hidden charges ad studies progress?

  None except for the optional summer school and your own printing costs etc.
- 6. How will examinations be taken?

The course does not assess by formal examination method. The assessment on the course consists of coursework (a mix of case study analysis, reports, presentations, individual and group work).

7. Will there be a member from the faculty to deliver a lecture in my country of residence (outside the UK)?

This is a 100% online course and we do not anticipate tutors delivering abroad – however there may be an opportunity for a guest speaker or member of the faculty conducting their lecturer abroad.

- 8. Who is eligible to attend 2 week summer school in the UK?

  Anyone registered on the distance learning programme will be eligible to attend summer school (subject to UKBA requirements).
- 9. Are students able to come only during the summer? As students of the university, you will have full access to online facilities and (subject to UKBA requirements), access to the campus and Faculty of TEE, BCU. However, the course is advertised as 'Distance Learning' so there will need to be some justification for attendance and prior approval – hand-in-hand with UKBA.
- 10. What cost will be involved in the summer school?

  The student will need to bear the cost of travel, accommodation and sustenance whilst in the UK. Field trips and visits to partner organisations and companies will be paid by the university.
- 11. What advantage will a student have over one who does not attend the summer school?
  - The students will have an opportunity to make full use of campus based facilities such as the learning centre and students union. Also, par-take in field visits, meet your tutors and fellow students, attend guest lectures and generally get involved with life on-campus.
- 12. Will regular Video conferencing be done with individual students or the whole class?

There will be regular timetabled sessions for the whole class; however, if individuals need to discuss something pertinent to them, then a mutually convenient time can be arranged between the tutor and the student for an on-line conference.
