
The Education Liaison team looks forward to working with you and supporting you with appropriate information, advice and guidance for your staff and learners.

# **EVENTS FOR POST-16 LEARNERS**


Our events for post-16 learners include a bi-annual higher education convention aimed at year 12 and 13 students. This timely event will cover topics for each stage of the planning and research process.






