

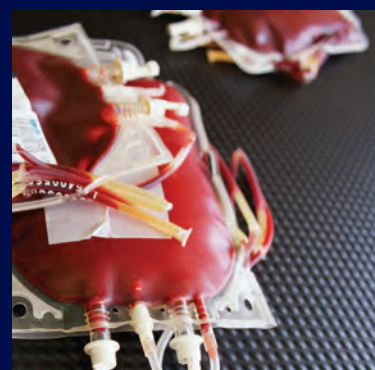

- A Degree in Higher Education or equivalent.

- Evidence of appropriate study at Level 6 with relevant experience, which we'll ask you to demonstrate by presenting a portfolio of your work.

COURSE OVERVIEW

The Postgraduate Certificate in Haematology offers the opportunity for qualified practitioners involved in this specialist area to enhance their knowledge skills and expertise.

All programmes offer a convenient part-time format to fit around home and work commitments.

COURSE CONTENT

The course consists of four modules. Three core modules:

- Fundamentals of Malignant Conditions
- Therapeutic Interventions in Haematology
- Preconditioning Therapy and Haemopoietic Stem Cell Transplantation

Plus one other relevant optional module from the Dimensions in Healthcare Framework in negotiation with the pathway leader.

Each module is 150 hours of study time made up of 30 timetabled hours and 120 hours of private study.

You can choose to study the whole Postgraduate Certificate, or you can simply pick modules that suit your needs and the needs of your organisation.

ASSESSMENT

Modules will be assessed by a range of different methods but there will be no written examinations.
