ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

At least 280 UCAS points obtained from a minimum of one 12-unit or two six-unit A Levels, plus at least two GCSEs at grade C or above, including English language and mathematics or equivalent qualifications.

Please note: You must already have the required GCSE grades stated above at the point of application.

COURSE OVERVIEW

- This course uses practical skills and reflection techniques to introduce you to accounting and finance, and provides you with a foundation of business knowledge and skills in both a national and international context.
- It allows you to build a theoretical underpinning of the subjects, and gain critical and analytical techniques to create and interpret vital financial statements and economic performances of any business.
- BA (Hons) Accountancy and BA (Hons) Accounting and Finance share a core first year so you could transfer from one course to another at the end of the year.
