## **Graduate Diploma in Law (Common Professional Examination)**

The Graduate Diploma in Law (Common Professional Examination) is recognised by many overseas professional bodies, e.g. Pakistan, Bangladesh and Sri Lanka.

It is a one-year, full-time law conversion course for graduates of any subject. Upon graduation, you can go on to study the one-year Bar Professional Training Course (BPTC) to qualify as a barrister or the one-year <u>Legal Practice Course</u> (LPC) to qualify as a solicitor.

## **Admission requirements**

- Bachelor's degree in any subject from the UK or Ireland.
- Students with an overseas degree have to apply to either the <u>Solicitors Regulation</u>
  <u>Authority or the Bar Standards Board</u> for a Certificate of Academic Standing. A
  certificate will only be issued if the applicant's degree is deemed equivalent to a UK
  Bachelor's degree. The Bar Standards Board will only issue a Certificate if the overseas
  degree is at least to the standard of a second class honours.
- English Language proficiency IELTS 6.5 or equivalent

## **Applications**

Applications for the Graduate Diploma in Law must be made **online** through the Central Applications Board (CAB).

Intending solicitors who hold an overseas degree must obtain a Certificate of Academic Standing from the <u>Solicitors Regulation Authority</u> (SRA). It will only issue the certificate if your overseas degree is at least equivalent to a UK Bachelor's degree. To obtain a Certificate of Academic Standing from the SRA, email cau@sra.org.uk

Intending barristers who hold an overseas degree must obtain a Certificate of Academic Standing from the <u>Bar Standards Board</u> (BSB). The BSB will only issue the certificate if the overseas degree is at least equivalent to a UK second class honours degree. To obtain a Certificate of Academic Standing from the BSB, email SBehr@barstandardsboard.org.uk

NB: If you intend to undertake the Bar Professional Training Course upon completion of the Graduate Diploma in Law it is **essential** that a Certificate of Academic Standing is obtained from the BSB and **not** the SRA.
