COURSE OVERVIEW

The Postgraduate Certificate in Adult Cancer Care offers the opportunity for qualified practitioners involved in this specialist area to enhance their knowledge skills and expertise.

All programmes offer a convenient part-time format to fit around home and work commitments.

COURSE CONTENT

The course consists of four modules. Three core modules:

- Fundamentals of Malignant Conditions
- Management of Adults with Cancer
- Symptom Management in Palliative and End of Life Care

This course provides the opportunity for undergraduate and graduate level students to develop your professional and academic abilities in the field of Adult Cancer Care encourage you to think independently and creatively, and integrate theory and practice in your specialist field.

The course design is flexible to enable practitioners to plan a programme of study that will meet professional and personal learning needs.

Each module is 150 hours of study time made up of 30 timetabled hours and 120 hours of private study.
