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Primary QTS School Based Training *Exciting changes for 2017/18*

BA Year 1 – A New Placement – New Opportunities Following extensive consultation with our school partners and having taken on board a range of opinions and advice, we are proud and excited to be putting in place a new, more flexible model of School Based Training placements for our Year 1 BAQTS trainee teachers starting in October 2017.

How it works

Trainees will spend one day per week in school starting after October half term. This will be followed by a two week block placement at the end of January 2018. Building upon progress made, the trainees will then continue to spend one day a week in school and then complete a further two week block placement in May 2018.

The benefits for our Trainees

This new improved placement will:

- Enable trainees to begin working in schools alongside qualified teachers at an earlier stage in their first year.
- Provide trainees with the opportunity to develop a longer term relationship with their school colleagues and children;
- Provide opportunities for trainees to develop their knowledge and understanding of teaching, learning and assessment, working with children in more than one class;
- Support their professional development through a continuous cycle of school based work followed by critical reflection during university based sessions.

The benefits for our school partners

- Teachers and children will develop a longer term relationship with their trainees;
- Trainees can support teachers in class more effectively, working with groups of children and individuals to make progress towards their targets;
- Trainees can support the work of the school in more than one class during the year;
- Schools can benefit from welcoming the trainees back for their final Yr3 placements and this could support their recruitment of NQTs;
- Working with Year 1 trainees can be an excellent opportunity for teachers to develop their own skills of mentoring, lesson observation and providing feedback and also thus inform their own professional practice and CPD;
- BCU will provide bespoke mentor training based in cluster schools.
- A new increased payment structure has been introduced for schools able to support our BA Year 1's this academic year. Further information can be found on page 7.

PGCE Primary & Early Years Education *Exciting changes for 2017/18*

As part of the University 'Transforming the Curriculum' we are excited as a Course Team to have been able to develop the PGCE Primary & Early Years course after consultation with our school partners and external examiners. We have endeavoured to take on board ideas from a wide variety of stakeholders to enhance the development of the teachers of the future.

What does this look like?

Trainees will spend the first week of term in a school setting enabling them to observe experienced teachers developing routines and relationships with their new class.

There are three taught modules and within the new improved timetable trainees will have the opportunity to look at pedagogy in university and then within the same week see this in practice in school.

During the year trainees will experience School Based Training in two different school settings and two different key stages. The first School Based Training takes place in the autumn term where trainees build up to teaching two lesson per day. The second placement will be completed over the spring and summer terms. Initially trainees will get to know their classes by teaching small intervention groups and during the summer term build up to 80% whole class teaching timetable.

Benefits of these changes:

- Enable trainees to observe qualified teachers at an earlier stage in the school;
- Provide trainees with the opportunity to develop a longer term relationship with their school colleagues and children;
- Support their professional development through a continuous cycle of school based work, followed by critical reflection during university based sessions.
- Teachers and children will develop a longer term relationship with their trainees;
- Trainees can support teachers in class more effectively, working with groups of children and individuals to make progress towards their targets.

Primary QTS School Based Training *Mentor Training*

To support new and existing mentors, we offer a fully funded initial mentor training activity which is available online to all school partnership colleagues. To access the online training programme go to:

Primary QTS School Based Training *Partnership Models*

Leading Partnership Schools

School mentors will supervise, support and assess trainees throughout the school experience, including signing off trainees' School Based Training Files, providing support and feedback on preparation, planning, teaching and learning. School mentors will observe trainees' teaching and identify development targets. They will assess trainees' progress at the interim points, identify developmental targets, assess progress at the summative point and prepare a report on achievements and targets for development.

Leading Partnership Schools will be able to access CPD opportunities offered by Birmingham City University or choose to receive iPads in lieu of payments.

Associate Partnership Schools

Class teachers provide advice and support to trainees and university mentors assess trainees' progress at the interim and summative points. Associate Partnership Schools will receive monetary recognition for the School Based Training they host.

We would strongly encourage Associate Schools to look towards becoming Leading Partnership Schools where staff are trained as school mentors. To support schools we will provide mentor training at no cost to the school and a named university mentor will support schools during the transition of status.

AUTUMN TERM BAQTS YEAR 3 SCHOOL BASED TRAINING

PPSE (9 Days): 2-6 October and 9-13 Oct 2017 Block (8 Weeks): 16 Oct-14 Dec 2017

Trainees will complete two sets of school based attachment days followed by a short block placement. The placement can operate as a paired or single placement and is designed to develop the trainees' knowledge and understanding of the Teachers' Standards (DFE, 2012). The placement will follow a cycle of school based work, followed by critical reflection during University sessions.

Year 1 Trainees will spend one day per week in school starting after October half term followed by a two week block placement at the end of January. During this first block trainees will teach a minimum of one lesson per day, planning and teaching for the whole class on their own (with partner as TA if in a paired placement)

Building upon progress made, the trainees will then continue to spend one day per week in school and complete a further short block placement towards the end of May. During this second block the trainees will plan and teach two lessons per day (on alternate days) for the whole class (with partner as TA if in a paired placement). Trainees should also work with groups and one-to one as directed by the class teacher and have the opportunity to observe good practice across the school.

Trainees will complete preliminary visits and a six week block placement starting the placement by planning for small groups and 1:1 interventions and building up to teaching the whole class for 40% of the timetable by the end of week 2. Trainees continue to build up to planning and teaching for 60% of the timetable by the start of the week 4. This school based learning is designed to build upon trainees' knowledge and understanding of teaching and learning, assessment and behaviour management strategies, developed through the taught programme and during their first School Based Training experience.

Trainees will complete preliminary visits and an eight week block placement in the autumn term. Starting the placement with a minimum whole class teaching commitment of 50%, building up to teaching and taking responsibility for the class for 80% of the timetable by the start of the 5th week at the latest. Trainees will develop confidence in using formative assessment to secure children's progress and will become increasingly accountable for children's attainment and progress. Trainees will participate in all classroom procedures including registration, assessment and tracking. This placement will be assessed against the Teachers' Standards.

All of our trainees have had School Based Training briefings regarding their placement and all our trainees and school colleagues are supported by experienced supervising University tutors from the Primary Education course. The University provides training and moderation meetings for all School Mentors.

PGCE Primary and Early Years with QTS

School Based Training Overview

During the course, trainee teachers will undertake two assessed School Based Training placements.

AUTUMN TERM PGCE SCHOOL BASED TRAINING 1

Autumn Term SBT1

PPSE (7 Days): 3, 10, 17, 30, 31 Oct; 1, 2, Nov 2017 Block (5 Weeks): 6 Nov – 8 Dec 2017 Additional Experience (5 Days): 18 Dec – 22 Dec 2017

Trainees will complete preliminary visits and a five week block placement. This experience, where possible, will operate as a paired placement so trainees will work together to support their professional development.

From the start of the block placement trainees each teach one lesson per day and include their partner in their planning. By the end of the placement, in negotiation with the class teacher, trainees should each teach 2 lessons per day. Trainees should support one to one learning and small focus group learning when not teaching the whole class. This placement is designed to develop trainees' understanding of the range of teaching, learning and professional skills as outlined in the Teachers' Standards (DFE, 2012) in the context of one-to-one, small/focus groups and whole class teaching. The expectation is that by week 4 trainees should be planning and teaching two whole class lessons per day. This placement will be summatively assessed against the Teachers' Standards.

SPRING AND SUMMER TERM PGCE SCHOOL BASED TRAINING 2

Spring Term PGCE SBT2a

PPSE (11 Days): 11, 12, 17, 18, 19, 24, 25, 26, 31 Jan; 1, 2, Feb 2018 Block (5 Weeks): 8 Feb – 27 Mar 2018

Trainees will be placed in a new school where they will complete preliminary visits and a five week block placement. Trainees will work with children and small groups identified by school data to support 'closing the gap' targets and will take some responsibility for whole class teaching. This placement will be formatively assessed against the Teachers' Standards.

By the beginning of week three trainees should be teaching 50% of the time, whether that is whole class, intervention groups or one to one interventions. This school based learning is designed to build upon trainees' knowledge and understanding of teaching and learning, assessment and behaviour management strategies developed through the taught programme and School Based Training 1. Trainees have had input on and some experience of:

- The primary curriculum, planning and assessing the core and foundation subjects
- Behaviour management strategies, theories related to learning, formative and summative assessment processes, safeguarding, SEN
- Planning, teaching and assessing small groups, one to one interventions and whole classes.
- Trainees on 3-7 route will have had experience of teaching, planning and assessment in EYFS.

Summer Term PGCE SBT2b

PPSE (3 Days): 16/17, 18, 19 April 2018 Block (8 Weeks): 23 April – 22 June 2018

Trainees will complete preliminary visits and an eight week block placement in the Summer Term. Trainees start the placement with a minimum teaching commitment of 60% and build up to teaching and taking responsibility for the class for 80% of the timetable by the 5th week. Trainees will develop confidence in using formative assessment to secure children's progress and will become increasingly accountable for children's attainment and progress. Trainees will participate in all classroom procedures including registration, assessment and tracking. This placement will be assessed against the Teachers' Standards.



Primary QTS School Based Training

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Am I able to offer a placement to one trainee instead of a pair for PGCE School Experience 1?

A: Yes, you can offer a placement to one trainee but a paired placement is more beneficial to the trainees and frequently, the school as well. A paired placement offers the opportunity for more flexibility in terms of team teaching and peer development and assessment.

Q: Do the trainees on paired placements have to be based within the same class?

A: Most schools would base paired placements in the same class but, if you want paired trainees in different classes, that is fine, as long as they have opportunities to share planning and to team teach. Trainees placed in parallel classes in the same age group also works particularly well.

Q: I have trained through another institution, can I still be a school tutor/mentor?

- A: Yes, if you have trained as a school tutor mentor at another institution you can be a mentor for our trainees. Your named University Tutor will be happy to discuss this further with you. Please also see enclosed information about Online Mentor Training which we are pleased to offer to our Partner Schools.
- Q: Have all trainee teachers been subject to a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check prior to starting their placement?
- A: Yes, all of our trainees are required to complete an Enhanced DBS check prior to their acceptance on the course. Students will bring a copy of their safeguarding letter and photographic student ID with them on their first day. Please contact us if your school will require additional forms of ID.

Q: Where can I find key information about the course?

A: All key information, including dates and documents, is available on our website: <u>www.bcu.ac.uk/education/partnerships</u>

Q: Can a class teacher also be the school mentor?

A: Yes, but ideally, having a separate mentor allows students to have another source of support within the school.

Q: If I can't attend the School Briefing Meeting, is there another way in which I can obtain the information required for the placement?

A: Yes. All relevant documentation relating to the placement will be sent out ahead of the start date. We are also able to send out a copy of the School Briefing presentation if required. The University Tutor assigned to your placement will also be on hand to answer any further questions you might have.
