United Kingdom and International Law

- The United Kingdom is party to 7 of the UN's 9 core human rights treaties
 - o **NOT** signed or ratified International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families (**CMW**)
 - The Migration and Economic Development Partnership with Rwanda (MEDP) does not comply with the Convention (and Protocol) Relating to the Status of Refugees
 - o Nationality and Borders Act 2022 must be applied consistently with international law

Ratification of CMW

- 12 recommendations concerning the ratification of CMW were made at the 3rd cycle: Chile (134.10); Bangladesh (134.30); Guatemala (134.23); Kyrgyzstan, Philippines, Algeria, Egypt (134.24); Nigeria (134.25); Sri Lanka (134.26); Syria (134.27); Turkey (134.28); and Uruguay (134.29)
- All of these were **noted**


Reduction of Immigration Detention Time Limits

- 4 recommendations concerning immigration detention time limits were made at the 3rd cycle: Brazil (134.215);
 Germany (134.217); Mexico (134.218); and Bangladesh (134.219)
- All of these were **noted**

Hate Crime and Social Integration

- 4 recommendations concerning hate crime and social integration were made at the 3rd cycle: Iran (134.82);
 Guatemala (134.99); China (134.121); and Lebanon (134.214)
- 3 of these were supported and 1 was noted





Recommendations

- We recommend the United Kingdom
 - o **RATIFY** the International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families (**CMW**)
 - ENSURE that the Nationality and Borders Act 2022 is applied in compliance with the Convention (and Protocol) Relating to the Status of Refugees
 - o **REPEAL** the **MEDP**
 - o INTRODUCE a statutory time limit on immigration detention in line with UNHCR guidance
 - o **REVIEW** and revise the **Hate Crime Action Plan**, ensuring that it recognises the particular issues and barriers that affect migrants
