## Tuition Fee Deposit Refund Policy

- 1. Tuition fee deposits are refunded in full under the following circumstances:
  - Where a student visa application is rejected in writing by the Embassy / High Commission. Should a visa application be rejected, the University requires you to attach the following documents to the refund request:
    - A copy of the Visa Rejection Notification from the High Commission
    - The original Birmingham City University Tier 4 Visa Letter
    - A request in writing with original signature

The refund will not be given if the UK Government has cancelled a visa as a result of a breach of visa conditions or if the refusal is due to falsified documents.

 Where there are exceptional circumstances beyond your control such as illness or bereavement of an immediate member of family.

An application for this type of refund must be supported by Certified Documents such as a Doctor's certificate and / or relevant documents verifying the situation. Decisions regarding exceptional circumstance refunds are at the discretion of the Assistant Director of the International Office.

- In the event of a default by Birmingham City University due to the following circumstances:
  - when the University does not offer a course on the advertised start date
  - when the University terminates a course after the course start date and before the course completion date
  - when the University does not provide a course as advertised, due to sanctions or circumstances beyond its control
- 2. No refunds, other than for exceptional circumstances, will be made <u>once you have arrived</u> in the UK and after the commencement date of the course.
- 3. Should any student be found to use fraudulent documents at the time of application or at the time of applying for entry clearance, <u>no refund</u> will be due.
- 4. Any requests for refunds should be sent to Nicola Lawley, PA to the Director of the International Office, <a href="mailto:nicola.lawley@bcu.ac.uk">nicola.lawley@bcu.ac.uk</a>.
- 5. For refunds of £3,000 or more, you will be asked to sign a letter under the 2007 Money Laundering Act. These refunds will be returned to the source, i.e. to the person who made the original payment/s.
