Recommendations by the UPR Project at BCU (Cited in the OHCHR's Summary of Stakeholders' Submissions as "UPR Project at BCU") (A/HRC/WG.6/42/LKA/3)

Recommendations for EUMS to provide for Sri Lanka's UPR:

Death Penalty:

- Uphold and enforce its international obligations to safeguard the right to life, pursuant to Articles 6, 7 and 14 of the ICCPR.
- Whilst it retains the death penalty, ensure it complies with the 'most serious crimes' principle, under Article 6 ICCPR, which restricts punishment to crimes of intentional killing only.
- Ratify the **Second Optional Protocol to the ICCPR** aiming at the abolition of the death penalty.
- Formalise its de facto moratorium, with a view to abolition, within the next three years.
- Ensure its NHRI, Human Rights Commission Sri Lanka, complies fully with the **Paris Principles** and provide it with a mandate on legislative abolition of the death penalty.
- Ensure its prisons comply with the United Nations' Standard Minimum Rules for the Treatment of Prisoners.
