Funding Opportunity for Health Visitors: Birmingham City University - multiple births online module

Information to Applicants

1. Background

A local health visitor has left Birmingham City University a legacy to be used to support health visitor continuing professional development. A portion of this legacy is available to fund up to 10 health visitors to undertake the multiple births online module: 'The individualised care of multiple birth families from conception to one year', which will commence 23rd September 2019. This module has been developed by the Elizabeth Bryan Multiple Births Centre and Birmingham City University (http://www.bcu.ac.uk/ebmbc) For further information about the online module see: https://www.bcu.ac.uk/courses/cpd-multiple-birth-families.

2. Who should apply?

Those who apply must be:

- health visitors currently registered and practising in the UK
- ✤ available to commence the online module 23rd September 2019
- able to provide confirmation of managerial support to undertake the module

Eligible applicants must provide in their application a rationale for undertaking the module. They must also demonstrate ways in which undertaking this module will develop their practice and enhance the care and support they provide to multiple birth families.

3. Scope of the Funding

The funding covers the cost of the online module fee only. This includes access to Birmingham City University library resources and module tutorial support. The funding <u>does not include</u> the purchase of books / journals, IT equipment / software or materials that may be required for the module assessment.

4. Amount available

The online module fee is £680 or £400 for the non-accredited version.

5. Timescale

The closing date for applications is 08.00 on **31/07/2019**. Any applications received after this date / time will be ineligible. All applicants will be informed of the result of their application by 09/08/2019 by email. When you reach the section on the form regarding funding, upload the email confirming that you have secured this funding.

Your application will only be assessed if:

- You meet the eligibility criteria set out above.
- Your completed and signed application is received by the closing date / time.

If you are successful, you will be expected to provide a one-page report on completion of the online module.

8. Selection Process

A selection panel consisting of three members will assess all applications. This panel will include representation from the Elizabeth Bryan Multiple Births Centre, a health visitor and a Birmingham City University lecturer. The panel's decision will be final. All applicants will be informed by email of the outcome of their application. We are unable to give feedback on unsuccessful applications due to the number of applications we receive.
