<b>5</b>	<b>Module Overview</b>
<p>Welcome to the module Return to Practice Midwifery, which is provided on the City South Campus.</p> <p>This is a single module which has been developed in line with NMC standards and consultation with practice partners from local NHS Trusts. The module is delivered over a period of up to 45 weeks, with learning activities including face-to-face contact, on-line learning and practice-based learning as agreed with the professional navigator.</p> <p>Evidence of undertaking the required study/practice learning is made within the Professional Practice Profile; this evidence is used then to illustrate attainment of competence at programme completion. An interview with the named sign-off mentor will be held at the initial, midway and end points through the programme to provide support and guidance, and by the final interview to sign you off as ready to return to the midwifery part of the NMC register.</p> <p>The programme MOODLE site reinforces the theoretical and clinical requirements of the programme. A variety of flexible learning methods are used to appeal to the students individual learning styles including lectures, discussions, simulation, role play, seminar presentations, case review, group work, outside speakers, ex-students presentations and clinical experience including visits, interviews and reviews, audit participation, meetings, guideline development, liaison with nurses and service users as planning to meet individual needs. Guided-study, independent learning, discussion, debates, quizzes, question and answer sessions, audio visual aids, utilisation of IT resources and on-line technologies.</p>
