Library Rules and Regulations	<p>A number of changes have been made to the Library Rules and Regulations in response to the ongoing disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and in order to comply with the latest government guidance, public health advice and pandemic-related legislation. Changes include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In order to use the library facilities on campus, a space must be booked via an online booking system</li> <li>• The introduction of a Click and Collect service and an auto-renewal system</li> <li>• The temporary closure of School of Art and the School of Jewellery libraries due to social distancing restrictions (items can be requested through the Click &amp; Collect service)</li> <li>• Access for external visitors and borrowers (including Alumni) is currently suspended</li> <li>• The introduction COVID-19 measures including social distancing, following one way traffic flows and the wearing of face coverings in library spaces unless exempt</li> <li>• Only drinks in sealed containers may be consumed in the libraries. Food is no longer permitted in library spaces due to COVID-19 cleaning regimes.</li> </ul> <p>Full details of all of the changes made can be found in the “Revision History” section at the end of the Library Rules and Regulations. 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Student Disciplinary Procedure	This procedure was updated in September 2020 following the introduction of the Academic Misconduct Procedure (see entry below). This procedure now only deals with “general misconduct” and no longer covers academic misconduct. Academic Misconduct Procedure	The University introduced a new Academic Misconduct Procedure for the beginning of the 2020/21 academic year (effective from 21 September 2020) and it is designed to support students in developing academic integrity and in understanding where action they take might compromise that integrity. The Procedure sets out the process the University will follow and the penalties we may apply, in cases where we believe a student may have compromised their academic integrity by committing academic misconduct. Academic misconduct was previously dealt with under the Student Disciplinary Procedure. COVID-19 Student Behavioural Policy (Annex to the Student Disciplinary Procedure)	<p>The following paragraph was added:</p> <p>‘Where Security Services staff identify serious or repeated breaches taking place on campus, they are empowered to remove you from University premises immediately and to suspend your University access card for a period of 24 hours.
