Recommendations by the UPR Project at BCU and Research Society of International Law Pakistan (Cited in the OHCHR's Summary of Stakeholders' Submissions as "UPR BCU" and "JS20") (A/HRC/WG.6/42/PAK/3)

Recommendations for EUMS to provide for Pakistan's UPR:

Death Penalty:

- Uphold and enforce its international obligations to safeguard the right to life, pursuant to Articles 6, 7 and 14 of the ICCPR.
- Whilst it retains the death penalty, ensure it complies with the 'most serious crimes'
 principle, under Article 6 ICCPR, which restricts punishment to crimes of intentional
 killing only.
- Ratify the **Second Optional Protocol to the ICCPR** aiming at the abolition of the death penalty.
- Develop, in consultation with civil society and relevant regional bodies, a **comprehensive action plan to work towards a moratorium**, with a view to abolition, within the next three years.

National Human Rights Institution:

- Ensure the National Commission for Human Rights of Pakistan (NCHR) is in line with the **Paris Principles** by providing it with independence to work free of political interference.
- Extend the NCHR's mandate and strengthen its powers to ensure it can investigate all allegations of human rights violations committed by State entities.

Business and Human Rights:

• Aid the Ministry of Human Rights in the implementation of the National Action Plan on Business and Human Rights.
