Karen McGrath, BCU's Head of Secondary and Post 16, is a trustee with The Precious Trust, a charitable organisation founded in memory of murdered Aston teenager Letitia Shakespeare. The charity runs a programme of workshops for girls and young women aged between 11 and 25 years who are at risk of youth violence, gang involvement, and criminal and sexual exploitation. The Precious Choices Education **Programme** aims to equip females with key skills and knowledge, challenge harmful behaviours and attitudes, and enable individuals to begin to cope and recover from previous wounding situations and relationships. The Precious Trust is currently offering FREE sessions to schools, youth groups, residential homes and charities. #### 2022/23 Primary and Early Years Placement Opportunities Packs and Expressions of Interest

Our **2022/23 primary and early years placement requests** will be circulated to new and existing partner schools immediately after half term.

#### SBT Placement updates

Secondary PGCE Contrasting School Placements start immediately after half term.

Secondary BA/ BSC (Hons) Year 1 and Year 3 trainees are on SBT currently.

Primary PGCE SBT 2 starts immediately after half term.

Primary BA The Year 1 complete their first three week block this week, having carried out observations and tasks. They have supported pupils in class and begun to develop the foundations required for teaching on their three-week block in the summer. They will continue to go into school every Tuesday from now until then, to continue to develop their knowledge and skills.

We are still seeking Year 1 and Year 2 School Based Training Placements for PE and Biology trainees in the region. These placements could be combined as both block placements occur at different times in the summer term. ### Early Career Framework in Partnership with Capita and UOB

School leaders will be considering which ECF Partner to engage for their incoming Early Career Teachers. Let us take this opportunity to remind you that **BCU are a delivery partner for the Capita and UOB partnership**. This model has a sound online infrastructure to guide ECTs and their mentors through the ECF curriculum and sources training material from regional school partners - with authentic West Midland voices! Our delivery model takes into consideration regional contexts and knowledge, in addition we offer ECTs the opportunity to work in bespoke small groups for ECF Clinic sessions with BCU's SEND, KS1, KS2 and Secondary expert colleagues. ### **Mentor Training**

Secondary PGCE Mentor CPD2 was attended by just under 50% of mentors from across the partnership. This drop in attendance was expected considering the challenges all schools are facing with ongoing staff absences due to Covid infections. Nevertheless. termly CPD events are identified as a core requirement for all partnership PGCE mentors; therefore. This key session reviewed ways to set high leverage targets, ways to link BCU content to SBT and reviewed the logistics for contrasting school SBT.
