What we do

- As a registered charity we help individuals to develop their practice so that they can provide the very best possible advice, support and care to patients. We achieve this through awarding project grants and bursaries.
- Additionally, our hardship funding provides assistance to members of the nursing team in times of need, providing that extra support they may need to get their lives back on track.

Our Grants Programme provides funding for clinical research and supports innovative projects which make a difference to service development and the safety, quality and dignity of patient care.

BURSARY: MONICA BALY BURSARY - NOW OPEN

The Monica Baly Bursary is awarded annually for the promotion of scholarship in nursing history. The bursary is for a minimum of £300 and a maximum of £1,000 which the winner can use to undertake activities related to the history of nursing, including courses, projects, or research.

Eligibility Criteria for this scheme:

Applications are welcome from those who wish to focus on the history of nursing.

Those who wish to apply must:

- be UK-registered nurses or UK-based nursing students
- be commencing, or continuing, the activity for which funding is sought between October 2015 and October 2016

Closing date: 6 July 2015

How to apply: Please download the application form and application guidelines

Previous recipients of a Monica Baly bursary are not eligible to apply again within four years of their award.

First time applicants may be given priority.



BURSARY: RCN FOUNDATION HEALTH CARE ASSISTANT AWARDS

Awards are available for funding course fees, study day fees or awarding body registration fees.

Applications may be submitted at any time during the year. However applicants should apply well ahead of their proposed study/activity as it could take up to 8 weeks to advise the outcomes of applications. The maximum amount awarded will not exceed £250.

Please note that there is a limit to the amount of funding available and not all applications will be successful.

The Awards are open to Health Care Assistants* who meet all the following criteria:

- A vocational qualification in health and care
- Fully completed application form
- Rationale/reasons for educational activity included, clearly identifying nature of activity and the potential impact on patient care
- Written support from manager either included with application or sent under separate cover



RCN FOUNDATION PROFESSIONAL BURSARY SCHEME

Bursaries to support individuals in learning and development activities that enhance patient care, patient experience, and development in nursing practice.

This scheme is currently closed but will reopen for applications later in 2015. Offered twice a year, bursaries of up to £5,000 are available for activities which focus on:

primary care nursing, and/or long term/chronic conditions

(This includes, for example, obesity, mental health, children's/young people's services, older people and dementia.)

Open to all nurses and midwives currently registered in the UK, and health care assistants/assistant practitioners based in the UK, who will be undertaking their learning and development in the UK.

Applicants must be

- nurses/midwives currently registered in the UK or health care assistants/assistant practitioners based in the UK
 - will be undertaking their learning and development activity in the UK



RCN FOUNDATION AND FLORENCE NIGHTINGALE FOUNDATION TRAVEL SCHOLARSHIPS

- This is a new opportunity for nurses and midwives wishing to demonstrate the role of clinical leadership in the management of long term conditions.
- We would be particularly interested in applicants who wish to travel and study new models of care, patient safety and improvement projects, and bring back evidence to improve the care of people with long term conditions in their local community and the wider UK.

RCN FOUNDATION WORSHIPFUL COMPANY OF NEEDLEMAKERS EDUCATIONAL BURSARIES

Open to all nurses and midwives currently registered in the UK who will be implementing their learning and development. Available annually, bursaries of up to £1,000 to assist with funding learning and development activities that enhance patient care in one or more of the following areas:

- acute and emergency care
- maternity services
- orthopaedic and trauma care
- pain management
- palliative care
- practice nursing including travel health
- public health
- surgical nursing




